Course Description

The Nurse Aide program prepares students with the skills and abilities essential to providing basic care to residents of long-term care facilities. Topics include resident's rights, communication, safety, observation, reporting, and assisting residents in maintaining basic comfort and safety. Emphasis is on the effective interaction with members of the health care team. Students who successfully complete this course are eligible to apply to take the national certification exam scheduled by **Pearson VUE.** (exam fee included in tuition)

Applicant's Responsibilities

Must be a minimum of 16 years of age.

Prior to enrollment, each student **must** have a **background check** completed through **portal.castlebranch.com/hh80** the approved Howard College vendor.

Prior to acceptance, applicant must pass drug screen.

Upon registration, students must bring their social security card,

driver's license, or any state issued valid photo ID, and shot records showing they have had the **Hepatitis B Series.**

Grey or black scrubs required for clinicals.
